Our Church at Worship Pastor's Notes 11:00 A.M. - 12:30 P.M.

The topic of prayer is one of three or four subjects in the Christian life about which I receive the most questions from believers, or hear and observe the most frustration and exasperation from people. How do I pray continually? And how do I talk to God in prayer in a way that is real and doesn't feel like a formality or discussion with an imaginary being? Our friend Ellen provides some very helpful perspective on how to approach God and prayer in "Steps to Christ." Ellen recognizes that Christians often pray very little; whether we forget to bring our requests and needs to God or we struggle to believe that God will hear and answer us, it is an undeniable fact that we don't pray as much, as fervently, or as faithfully as we would like (65; 1977 edition). And she warns us that if we don't pray often, it is easier for the devil to surround us with an atmosphere that makes us more prone to continue neglecting prayer (65). But the solution Ellen gives to praying more is not found in what we do but what prayer is: "Prayer is the opening of the heart to God as to a friend. Not that it is necessary in order to make known to God what we are, but in order to enable us to receive Him. Prayer does not bring God down to us, but brings us up to Him" (64). Did you notice what Ellen says here? Prayer doesn't open God's heart to us; rather, it opens OUR hearts to God! Prayer doesn't bring God near to us, because he's already close to us; instead, prayer brings us near to God in relationship! Prayer, therefore, doesn't so much enable us to present requests to be fulfilled like a grocery list, as much as it enables us to RECEIVE God into our hearts and lives! And this is the reason why Jesus "is our example in all things" (64): because Jesus, by his life of prayer and love for God, shows us that the motivation to pray is love for God and trust in God, which will free us to lovingly entrust ourselves into God's care and invest in a relationship with him (64-65). Friends, would you like a more robust prayer life? Then take note of what prayer is. Prayer is not God opening himself to you, as if he doesn't like you. Because he loves you and already pursues a relationship with you, prayer is simply the time when you open yourself to him - which hopefully encourages you to keep praying. God bless.
